Description

This dataset provides a history of province-wide spatial data that shows lands in the province that have been registered as mining claims in the past. There are three types of mining claims: boundary cell, multi-cell, and single-cell. Each type has a unique tenure number and is represented by a single polygon. Boundary cell mining claim polygons may overlap other types of mining claim polygons. However, single cell and multi-cell polygons must not overlap. Gaps within and between polygons are allowed.
